Prophetic Vision Excerpt:

All activities in the body will give way for worship, and worship will be the central theme for all activities. Countless thousands will be swept into the churches day and night as the congregations continually flow into the sanctuary to worship the Most High God (Read Chapters 4-5 of 'The Worshiping You')

Use the following excerpts as prayer points & guidelines for meeting as needed:

John 4:23

As we study the Bible, we see that the ultimate activity and priority for us in eternity is worship (The Worshiping You pg.37) The eternal consequences of salvation are more than just escaping hell – they are to forever worship God (TWY pg.42)

The unchurched...will never be impressed by how hard we work for God, but they will be impressed by our love for Him since love never fails (TWY pg.38)

1 Corinthians 13:8

As worship to God is given priority, there will be a greater boldness to witness because of the tangible reality of God's presence in our churches (TWY pg.41)

The transforming power of His presence will become evident to millions of unsaved...they will run to churches where His presence is found...churches will start to cooperate together to accommodate the enormous inflow of new converts and backsliders. (TWY pg.41)

When God restores, there is an outpouring of His Spirit, resulting in revival and evangelism. We are on the brink of the greatest outpouring the Church has ever experienced. There will be mass evangelism that will sweep across nations and continents. Awesome signs and wonders will happen everywhere, all the time. God is restoring things in His church right now and you are His chosen vessel to achieve this. (School of Worship Level 1 – Restoration pg.103)

Definition of 'YADAH'

The word 'Yadah' conveys a strong emphasis on gratitude and thankfulness. It means: 'to use (i.e. hold out) the hand, physically to throw (a stone, an arrow) at or away; especially to revere or worship (with extended hands), to confess, praise, be thankful. 'Yadah' is an expression of thankfulness with the hands lifted. God wants us to be thankful for our salvation more than anything else but He also wants us to be thankful for everything He does in our lives. Yadah for being redeemed / saved (Psalm 107:1-2). Yadah is an eternal occupation (Psalm 52:9). Yadah is a witness to the unsaved (Psalm 18:49).
